



Philanthropy supports salaries and supplies so families never see a bill for this essential service.



Thanks to philanthropic support, patients never see a bill for this vital service.





#### SMART HEART CARE. CLOSE TO HOME

The new heart failure clinic at Sanford Bemidji opened in 2021-one year earlier than planned-thanks to philanthropic support for start-up and staff funding.

To date, the clinic has succeeded in its goal to keep patients out of the hospital by helping manage their heart conditions through medication and lifestyle changes, with the support of a full-time nurse navigator.



#### **RIDING FOR LOCAL KIDS**

For the health and safety of everyone involved, we made the tough decision to take the 25th annual Great American Bike Race (GABR) event virtual for the second year in a row in 2021. But our community still showed up in a big way, raising vital funds to support children and young adults across the Bismarck region who live with cerebral palsy and related early onset conditions. Funds raised assist with necessities like wheelchairs, therapy and more that are not fully covered by insurance.



#### REIMAGINE THE FUTURE OF CANCER CARE

In 2021, supporters pushed us past the halfway mark in the Reimagine campaign to transform the future of cancer care and research at the Sanford Roger Maris Cancer Center in Fargo. Every dollar is advancing cancer research, patient care and services, and education.





One in five U.S. adults experiences mental illness each year.


Almost the entire region served by Sanford Health is federally designated as a mental health provider shortage area.
